DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY

Before you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

1. Read Exodus 4:18-23. It's interesting to note that when Moses asked Jethro for his blessing to leave Midian, Moses did not tell him about meeting God. Do you think Moses did this on purpose? Why or why not? What does this say about Moses' state of mind at this time?

- 2. What encouragements did God give to Moses as he stepped out in faith? What do these reassurances tell you about God?
- 3. How has God's timing in the past been perfect in your life? How are you waiting on His timing for something right now?
- 4. How have you seen God's unmatched power displayed before in your life? How does that encourage you today as you wait for Him to act in your circumstances?
- 5. How has God radically rescued you in the past, in salvation or in other ways, that changed the course of your life? What does His rescue tell you about His care for you?
- 6. How does God's power act as fuel for your obedience to His Word?
- 7. What are some ways you can start this week to actively train yourself to focus on God's perspective, even as you ask Him for peace and understanding?
- 8. What has God's plan for your rescue done for your eternity? What has it done for your ability to walk daily in His freedom now?

"As Moses stepped out by faith, God spoke to him and encouraged him. God told Moses not to be afraid to return to Egypt, because his enemies were dead. Then He assured Moses that He would enable him to do the miraculous signs but that Pharaoh would only harden his heart and thereby invite more judgments from the Lord. Before Moses even arrived in Egypt, he knew he had a battle on his hands.... God was reminding Moses that he was the servant of a great God who knew what He would do. The key to victory was faith in the Lord."

"Moses had become thoroughly disillusioned. He regarded himself as a failure, the objects of his ministry (the Israelites) as hopeless, and God as unfaithful, uncaring, and even unable to deliver His people. He had learned his own inability to deliver Israel, but he did not yet believe in God's ability to do so. Even the miraculous revelation of God at the burning bush, and the miracles that God enabled Moses to perform, did not convince him of God's intention and power. One supernatural revelation, even one involving miracles, does not usually change convictions that a person has built up over years of experience. We not only need to believe in our own inability to produce supernatural change, as Moses did, but we also need to believe in God's ability to produce it."

- "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
