1 Kings 1:1-31

Review of David's Life

David, the king of God's choosing, is anointed by Samuel while Saul is king.

David has a heart for God which means he loves God and believes:

God is sovereign, completely righteous, always merciful, and God's will is always best.

After Saul dies, David takes the throne, wins the hearts of the Israelites, and unites Israel.

David's time of triumph turns to tragedy and trouble when he sins against God and suffers the consequences.

2 Samuel ends with David, a sinner, continuing to have his whole heart turned towards God.

Overview of 1 Kings

The continuing story of God's people is told through the reign of kings in Judah and Israel covering 400 years. Solomon's splendid reign is a time of peace, prosperity, and influence, but it ends with division and decline. Themes in 1 Kings are relevant to us and include God's sovereign control, God's faithfulness, a call for faithfulness from His people, and the true and trustworthy Word of God.
