## WALKING BY **HOME GROUP STUDY & DEVOTIONAL**

As you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

- 1. Read Exodus 20:1-11. Does the first commandment imply that there are other gods? Explain.
- 2. In his sermon the pastor said that if you live out the first commandment, the rest will follow. What does he mean by this?
- 3. What "gods" take you away from wholehearted devotion to the Lord? How did the sermon help you strategize ways to combat them?
- 4. Why is it good news that God loves you jealously and won't share you with other gods (v. 5)?
- 5. How serious was God about the Sabbath? What insight do you find in Exodus 31:13-17, 34:21 and 35:1-3?
- 6. How is the Sabbath law relevant for Christians?
- 7. Do you have a day you would consider your Sabbath? What does your rhythm for rest and replenishment look like?
- 8. In what ways can we misuse God's name besides cursing? Do you misuse God's name in any way? If so, confess and ask God to work on this area of your life.

One of the great events in the history of Israel, and perhaps in the history of all mankind, is the giving of the Law. The Law was not given so that the Israelites by keeping it could attain righteousness (Rom 3:20a; Gal 3:11). A righteous standing (justification) before God has always been only by faith (trust) in God (Gen 15:6; Rom 4:3, 22; 5:1; Gal 2:16; 3:6, 21). The Law functioned to show the Israelites their sinfulness (Rom 3:19-20b; 7:7) in contrast with God's standards of holiness and righteousness, and to condemn mankind. The Mosaic Law in Exodus has three parts: the Decalogue (Ex 20:1-21), the Book of the Covenant with civil and religious ordinances (20:22-24:11), and ceremonial regulations (24:12-31:18).

We now reach the climax of the entire Book, the central and most exalted theme, all that came before being, as it were, a preparation for it, and all that follows, a result of, and supplement to it. **UMBERTO CASSUTO**

Because of the teaching of the New Testament Epistles. In them we find the Ten Commandments recorded and enforced. At the close of Romans 3. where the apostle treats of Justification, he raises the question, "Do we then make void the Law through faith?" and the emphatic answer is "God forbid: yes, we establish the Law." In the same Epistle he declares again after quoting five of the Commandments. "Love is the fulfilling of the Law" (13:10), and love could not "fulfill" the Law if it had been abrogated. - 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)
- "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
- "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
