- 5. Looking at two ways to communicate the gospel in the box above, list situations when either would be used. What are the advantages of each?
- 6. If we don't actually "pop the question" and ask someone for a response at some point to God's offer of salvation, what is lost? How does that knowledge motivate you in sharing the gospel?

A WONDERFUL Offer

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

- 1. Admit that you're a sinner, separated from a holy and perfect God.
 - (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
- 2. Understand that the penalty for your sin is death – eternal separation from God and all that is good.
 - (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
- 3. Believe that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and conquered death by rising from the dead. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior from sin and death and your provider of true and eternal life.
 - (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)

You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in him alone as the only way to be reconciled to you. Thank you for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.
